A parish nurse through the St. Mary's Hospital parish nurse program is on staff at the CMC during the week if you call us in advance. The nurse is available for basic health consultation including discussing health concerns, monitoring blood pressure, basic first aid, diabetes management, and more. If further treatment is needed, the nurse can help with finding a doctor and connecting patients to appropriate medical resources. The nurse's office is located on the lower level along with the community meal program.

A FREE breast and cervical cancer screening program for women ages 45-64	
The Wisconsin Well Woman Program (WWWP) provides preventive health screening services to women with little or no health insurance coverage. Well Woman pays for mammograms, Pap tests, certain other health screenings, and multiple sclerosis testing for women with high risk signs of multiple sclerosis. The program is administered by the Wisconsin Department of Health Services, Division of Public Health, and is available in all 72 counties and 11 tribes. Well Woman pays for certain screenings for some of the most common women's health concerns.
