

Referral Sources for Housing Homeless Households

The intention of this document is provide Case Managers assistance when referring clients to housing options. If the person is literally homeless a VI-SPDAT should be completed and a referral made to the Housing Priority List. Not all Homeless Service Providers use the Housing Prioritization List to fill permanent housing units. To ensure your clients have access to all possible housing below is a list of other referrals you should consider:

Agency	Description	Application Info
Porchlight Inc	Porchlight will use the Prioritization List only to fill certain units. Your client needs to complete Porchlight's Application to get on the wait list for all other units. (Programs that will fill units from Prioritization List: Pheasant Ridge Trail, Scatted Sites Housing First, Nakoosa Trail, Rapid Re-Housing at Brooks Street, STABLE and 10 units at Lien Rd) -Both families and singles	http://porchlightinc.org/provide-housing/
YWCA of Madison	YWCA Madison's downtown location features affordable apartments for low-income women, providing a safe and supportive permanent home in the heart of Madison. Apartments are available to women who make less than \$32,600 per year. Public Housing (City & County)	Neither Madison's Community Development Authority or Dane County Housing Authority have a homeless preference to their wait list. Wait lists are sometimes closed. Check each agencies website to verify if they are accepting applications. -Families, singles with disability or considered elderly Affordable housing based on income- not a housing program with case management.
