Wisconsin Works (W-2), is a job-based program that provides cash assistance to eligible parents to help you prepare for a career. Through Wisconsin Works, you may be able to get:

- Connection to employers
- Work experience to develop valuable skills
- Skills training
- Caring career guidance
- Help in applying for Social Security benefits
- Help with transportation to interviews and/or work

½ PRICE 31-Day Bus Passes for people who can verify low income

Passes are now available for sale on a first-come, first-served basis on the 1st and 15th days of each month. Supplies are limited on both dates, so riders are encouraged to purchase their passes on or as close to these available dates as possible.

Eligibility

To be eligible to purchase a low income pass, riders must do ONE of the following:

- Fill out a self-certification form that income is at or below 150% of national poverty guideline. A 6-month Low Income Pass eligibility card will be issued.
- Show Low Income Pass eligibility card at time of purchase.
- Show their QUEST card at time of purchase.

Additional Purchase Information

- Purchases are limited to one pass per person, per month.

- Passes must be purchased in-person.
- Passes are available on a first-come, first-served basis.

PROGRAM NOTES

- Passes only available at outlets listed above.
- **Passes are available on a first-come, first-serve basis on the 1st and 15th** (or the next business day) of each month.
- Supplies are limited both on the 1st and 15th of each month
- Metro 31-Day Passes are the only passes available at the low-income rate.

HOW TO USE

- Insert pass into farebox "card reader"
- Activation date and time along with expiration date and time will be printed on pass.
- Slide through the magnetic "pass reader" when boarding.
- Do Not Laminate
